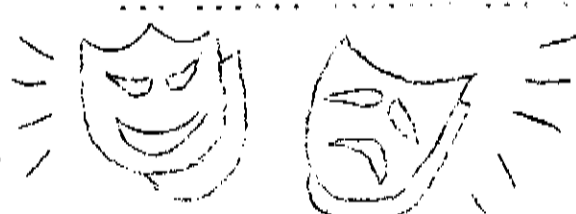

They climbed Mount Potash, a hike of 4 miles and 2660 ft; Boulder Loop, a 3 mile 2000 ft hike; Champney Falls which is a 3 mile trail and an easy 1900 ft; Imp Trail for the strong and John's favorite hike, 6 miles and 3175 ft; UNH trail on Mt.
