VARSIITY SWIM TEAM

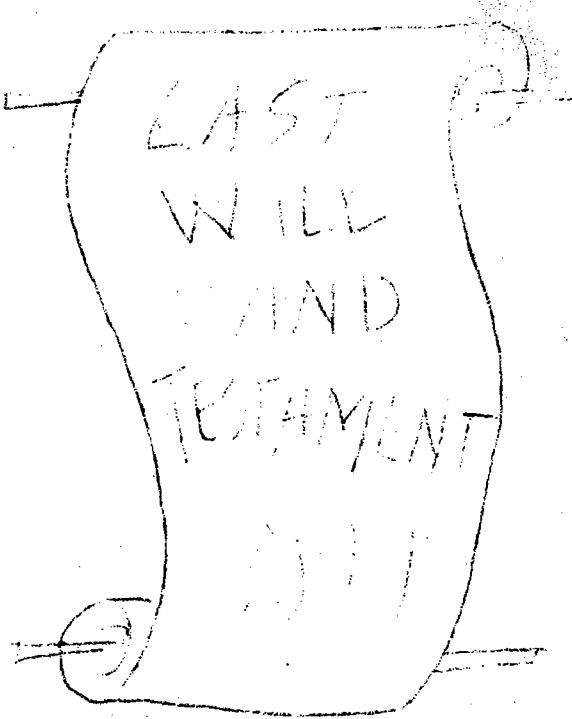
